Train Mountain Ramble Preparations Under Way

Steaming bays being added.

In preparation for the June 12 TM'03 Ramble that the JT&S RR Museum is hosting, the Team Ratliff (Allan, Brian and Greg) has started the addition of steaming bays.

They have poured footings for 5 additional bays, extended the retaining wall to the southeast to extend the length of the two new bays on the east side of the existing bays. They also relocated the air compressor to the power station, and rerouted the water flow from the wash underneath the Highline Bridge. All this was done on a rainy, cold and blustery weekend; it rained almost all day Saturday!

In addition, their plan calls for removing the switch in the current main line turntable lead and changing the current car barn track into an additional lead branching off at the curve to the mainline switch and placing a gauntlet track in the westernmost roundhouse track. This will allow a locomotive

The three bays to the west of the existing bays will all eventually be roundhouse bays, and are laid out so as to allow substantial work space between the tracks in the roundhouse. These bays will be on ground level until they reach the roundhouse doors and will then be elevated inside the roundhouse, allowing the construction of a scale model structure with full adult headroom.

Team Ratliff has taken some of the "scrap steel" such as that used in the original bays to their shop down in the valley and will be assembling the bays there preparatory to bringing them back up for installation on the work weekend of April 11th - 13th. Bill Shepherd is also planning on being at JT beginning on April 8th to do additional work on the car barn foundation and pit.

That will leave one work weekend in May to complete the preparations for the Ramble. I plan on being at JT from Thursday, May 22nd through Monday, May 26th if any of you care to plan to join me for that weekend to help out.

It has been proposed to add a passing siding on the mainline from the caretaker's grade crossing to the steaming bay shed irrigation valve box. This will greatly ease operations between the two loops and will reduce waiting time at the loop switches. There should be time between now and June 12th to get that siding in if we can get enough people out to help in grading and track laying. Let's see more of you out there enjoying the great spring weather and healthy exercise so that we can show our guests from the East Coast and Midwest what a real mountain RR is like! \bowtie

As momentum picks up, more and more is being accomplished by our intrepid band of folks.

President's Day Meet 2003

Over the course of the President's Day Weekend Meet, a temporary "tramway" was laid in the dry wash to facilitate the movement of materials to bridge footings. This effort was lead by Rick Mugele, GSD Chief Engineer, along with Ken Pimlott, his son Nick Pimlott, and Ken Eells. Jack Sessums and Lars Templin joined in on Sunday to help finish the tracklaying. The first lift of concrete was poured on the west pier using 60 pound rail driven down to bedrock to help shore it up.

Rick's hand grading efforts have produced fifty feet of new grade, as well as a fine start on the spur line down across the wash turning up toward the second crossing upstream. This spur line will eventually tie into the main line, and gives access to the 15" and 7 ½" interchange area adjacent to the SP caboose. Rick has been instrumental in creating a Master Plan for the trackage of both gauges by helping to develop the new wye and runaround tracks at the depot for the 7 ½" gauge, as well as his fabulous plan for the GSD 15" gauge. Thanks Rick!

Work progresses ahead on other fronts as well, including the turntable fabrication, headed by our "Roundhouse Foreman" Ken Eells, and the re-gauging of the Coffey Shay to 15" gauge (it was 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") by master builder Ken Kukuk.
